Did you know the month of May is considered National Military Appreciation Month in the United States? It was initiated by the United States Congress in 1999. During this month, Americans come together to thank service members and their families for their hard work, bravery, and sacrifices. It's a time to honor those who have served and continue to serve in the U.S. military, as well as to remember those who have died in the pursuit of freedom.

While many of us fly our American Flag with pride throughout the entirety of the year, May has a few significant days that are special for that flag to be flown with some extra pride.

VE "Victory Over Europe" Day marks the formal acceptance by the Allied Forces of Nazi Germany's unconditional surrender, which occurred in France on May 8th, 1945. While celebrations were held around the world, in the United States VE Day took place on then President Truman's 61st birthday. He dedicated the victory to his beloved predecessor, Franklin D. Roosevelt, who passed away almost a month prior on April 12th, 1945.

This year on May 18th, 2024, we celebrate Armed Forces Day. President Harry S. Truman conceived the idea of Armed Forces Day that was officially established in 1949. The creation of this holiday made sense due to the recent unification of all five branches of the U.S. military under the Department of Defense at that time. The goal was to have a single day of celebration for all branches. Armed Forces Day aims to thank and honor service members for their dedication and sacrifices. It falls on the third Saturday of May each year, which in 2024 happens to be May 18th.

In 1971, Memorial Day became an official federal holiday, observed on the last Monday of May. This year many Americans will observe Memorial Day on May 27, 2024, by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings or participating in parades. Did you know that each year on Memorial Day, a national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00 p.m. local time? Remember that Memorial Day is a day for reflection and remembrance, honoring those who make the ultimate sacrifice for our nation.

So, let's all get those American Flags up high and show that true patriotic spirit that is within all of us!

DAV Caregiver Support Program

DAV continues to be a vital force and instrument of positive change for so many veterans and their families because we refuse to settle for "good enough." We innovate, execute and lead the way in bringing positive change for our brothers and sisters in arms.

The DAV Caregiver Support Program is a no-cost initiative offers concierge support and resources to the friends, family members and loved ones who provide care to those who served. It helps improve the quality of life for veterans and their caregivers while extending the time they can live outside of healthcare facilities.

Powered by TCARE, a Service-Disabled Veterans-Owned Small Business founded by a DAV Patriot Boot Camp alumnus, the program allows veterans and their families to access tailored caregiver support and resources—including individual support from a trained specialist—at no cost.

The program officially launched in October. Through the DAV Caregiver Support Program, caregivers can access:

- Online resources and risk screening to better understand their role as a caregiver.
- Digital tools to support their caregiving responsibilities.
- Personalized care plans and one-on-one support from a trained caregiver specialist with experience supporting veterans and their loved ones.

By being provided with a proven support program, caregivers and the veterans they love benefit from improved relationships, reduced caregiver stress, depression and other negative health outcomes. Participants also develop increased resilience and the ability to navigate complex caregiving responsibilities, including health care systems and financial planning.

To participate, caregivers can follow three easy steps:

- **Register**—Visit <u>www.davcaregiver.org</u> to enroll in the program and complete the DAV Caregivers Support Program screen. The registration code is **DAV**.
- Access Resources and Support—Access online content, local resources and digital tools tailored to each caregiving situation, role and responsibility.
- **Receive Tailored Support**—Depending on the screening results, participants may receive one-on-one support from a trained caregiver specialist to help navigate caregiving responsibilities.

DAV is able to continue to expand our services in new and exciting ways because of the leadership and support of so many. We are grateful to each of you for helping make this exciting new program possible.

Warrants/Vouchers/Check Requests

The national bylaws provide for the proper procedure when issuing checks from unit accounts.

- The Adjutant shall initiate **all** warrants/vouchers/check requests on unit approved expenditures at a regular business meeting or as dictated by the approved unit standing rules
- Warrants/vouchers/check requests must be co-signed by the commander*
- The treasurer issues and signs checks in accordance with the warrant/voucher/ check request
- The commander co-signs the checks*

*In the absence of the unit Commander, the unit Senior Vice Commander shall co-sign checks. The unit Junior Vice Commander shall co-sign warrants/vouchers/check requests in the absence of the unit Adjutant.

Under no circumstances may a unit have a credit or debit card!
