Junior Activities by Tammy Sigman, National Junior Activities Chairman

The Juniors have been doing a lot of great work around the United States. The Junior Activities reports are coming in and the projects and community service these Juniors have been doing are fantastic. From making cards to helping with veterans lawn care needs, this just shows you the love that they have for our veterans and their families.

Also remember that when you have your elections the Junior members can be Patriotic Instructors, take up the money march and help with set-up of snacks at the meetings. Get them involved and they will continue on as senior members.

Families are encouraged to start a life membership for children to lock in the life membership rate of \$250.00 with a \$20 down payment. Parent or legal guardian signature is required. Payments can be made at the family's discretion. Any amount paid while under the age of 18 will be applied to the life membership amount of \$250.00.

Junior members of the DAV Auxiliary consist of boys and girls from birth through age 17. They are eligible for membership through a family member who is a DAV Auxiliary member or who served in the military and was honorably discharged.

Children 17 years old and younger are eligible for a complimentary membership that expires the day they turn 18 years old. Parent or legal guardian signature is required.

DAV Caregiver Support Program

DAV continues to be a vital force and instrument of positive change for so many veterans and their families because we refuse to settle for "good enough." We innovate, execute and lead the way in bringing positive change for our brothers and sisters in arms.

The DAV Caregiver Support Program is a no-cost initiative which offers concierge support and resources to the friends, family members and loved ones who provide care to those who served. It helps improve the quality of life for veterans and their caregivers while extending the time they can live outside of healthcare facilities.

Powered by TCARE, a Service-Disabled Veterans-Owned Small Business founded by a DAV Patriot Boot Camp alumnus, the program allows veterans and their families to access tailored caregiver support and resources—including individual support from a trained specialist—at no cost.

The program officially launched in October. Through the DAV Caregiver Support Program, caregivers can access:

- Online resources and risk screening to better understand their role as a caregiver.
- Digital tools to support their caregiving responsibilities.
- Personalized care plans and one-on-one support from a trained caregiver specialist with experience supporting veterans and their loved ones.

By being provided with a proven support program, caregivers and the veterans they love benefit from improved relationships, reduced caregiver stress, depression and other negative health outcomes. Participants also develop increased resilience and the ability to navigate complex caregiving responsibilities, including health care systems and financial planning.

To participate, caregivers can follow three easy steps:

- **Register**—Visit <u>www.davcaregiver.org</u> to enroll in the program and complete the DAV Caregivers Support Program screener. The registration code is **DAV**.
- Access Resources and Support—Access online content, local resources and digital tools tailored to each caregiving situation, role and responsibility.
- **Receive Tailored Support**—Depending on the screening results, participants may receive one-on-one support from a trained caregiver specialist to help navigate caregiving responsibilities.

DAV is able to continue to expand our services in new and exciting ways because of the leadership and support of so many. We are grateful to each of you for helping make this exciting new program possible.

VAVS by Patty Davis, National VAVS Representative

Last month, I had the privilege of representing DAV Auxiliary at the National Advisory Committee meetings in St. Louis, Missouri. During those meetings, Veteran Service Organizations meet with CDCE (Center for Development and Civic Engagement) Staff to discuss how we can recruit, retain and encourage volunteerism at our VA Medical Centers. We also celebrate the amazing work our volunteers do, network and plan for the future.

I am excited to share that DAV Auxiliary has seen an increase of 13,503 hours served in the VA Medical Center between FY 2022 and FY 2023. Furthermore, our organization is seeing a trend upwards in new volunteers. This means that our members are heading back into the VA's to serve veterans.

During our conference, one of the biggest takeaways with the discussion of regular versus occasional volunteers. With society being as it is today, CDCE is encouraging VSO's to recruit <u>occasional</u> volunteers instead of regularly scheduled volunteers. Occasional volunteers are what the CDCE demographic is. Those are the moms and dads with children who can only dedicate one day a month, but want to help. It is the college student who is passionate about serving in memory of a grandparent but has a lot on their plate. It's the family who is serving with their veteran. AND, the VA is working hard to RETAIN those hours. Many VSO's are NOT getting the occasional hours reported to them, which is missing hours used to showcase OUR organization. What a team effort we can work on to get new, occasional volunteers and make sure that we are accurately recording their hours. If you are a VAVS Representative, be sure that you're utilizing Form 50A to get as many monthly hours as possible from your facility volunteers and turning them in!

Thank you for sending in your annual VAVS reports. And thank you for taking the time to fill them out so accurately. This information will truly showcase our organization and what we each do to serve veterans in our VA System!
