- Complete your header: Unit chartered name, unit number, city and state. Remember to list your total senior members
- Meet with your members to complete the body of the report to make sure all Americanism activities done by the unit are recorded.
- Give specific details on the Special Americanism report: Place and date of the
  event, type of program, description, if the public invited, explain the media coverage, list the dignitaries and total number in attendance.
- Commander and/or the Chairman should sign the report

It is so important for all units to share their activities. They inspire, encourage and show how much we care about America and even more how much we care about our Veterans.

The following units shared with me some of the work they have done celebrating and uplifting veterans in their communities while promoting Americanism.

# Legislative by Terry Grabowski, National Legislative Chairman

Our National Commanders have been very busy and asking for your help. There are new people in office and we need to help our National Commanders let them know where we stand. You can do this by belonging to the COMMANDERS ACTION NETWORK (CAN). You can join by visiting <a href="https://www.dav.org/get-involved/advocate-on-legislation/">https://www.dav.org/get-involved/advocate-involved/advocate-on-legislation/</a>. If you need help joining, let me know and I will help you. You don't have to belong to DAV or DAV Auxiliary to join. Ask your friends, neighbors and relatives to help us in this mission. Please try to get at least one new person to join. Think how powerful we would be if every member would get one person to join before June 30, 2025.

Below are several very important bills that need your attention:

- H.R. 1860, the "Women Veterans Cancer Care Act," aims to designate Regional Breast and Gynecologic Cancer Care Coordinators to expand the work of the Breast and Gynecologic Oncology System of Excellence at the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- H.R. 2102, the Major Richard Star Act, is a bill in the 119th Congress that aims to allow veterans with combat-related disabilities to receive both their military retired pay and VA disability compensation.
- H.R3 1732, the GUARD VA Benefits Act, to amend title 38, United States Code, and reinstate penalties for persons charging veterans unauthorized fees relating to claims.
- S. 599/ H.R. 1288, collectively known as the Driver Reimbursement Increase for Veteran Equity (DRIVE)
  Act, aims to ensure veterans receive travel reimbursements for medical care that are at least equal to
  those provided to federal employees.

Someone who inspires and motivates others to progress and bring about change. Auxiliary members can also register with the Center for Development and Civic Engagement (VAVS) at your local VA Medical Center. Contact your Auxiliary Veterans Affairs Voluntary Services (VAVS) Representative for your area to help you with the process.

As you know, April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2025, was designated as the DAV Annual Community Impact Day. If you didn't complete a project that day, we encourage you to still participate sometime in the month of April! The purpose is to empower communities to support Veterans, raise awareness about the Veterans needs and to provide help. You can become a *Difference Maker*!

- ⇒ **Membership** The Mae Holmes report will show whether you had a membership drive and how many members you were able to recruit.
- ⇒ Americanism It shows how many programs, parades and essay contests your unit sponsored or participated in and lets you showcase your most outstanding Americanism activity.
- ⇒ **Legislation** You get to share how many meetings your Unit discussed Veterans' bills and how many Federal, State and local contacts were made by your unit members.
- ⇒ **Junior Activities** You get to brag on your juniors and all they have done to help your unit and our veterans and their families!
- ⇒ VAVS and Community Service You get to brag on yourselves and share the amount of money and/or goods that were donated, how many hours were volunteered, and in the case of Community Service how many miles were driven to perform your services. And don't forget, if you donated over \$1000, attach your VAVS and/or Community Service report form.
- ⇒ And lastly, if your unit **sponsored or participated in any other special projects** make sure you let National know.

So, get those Mae Holmes reports in by your state deadlines... Who knows April "Mae" bring your unit a winning report at state or national. Even if you don't win, it will definitely show National that you are working to fulfill the DAV Auxiliary mission of helping veterans and their families! I can't wait to see what you all have done – happy reporting!

## 2025 National Convention

Join us for the 2025 DAV and DAV Auxiliary National Convention in Las Vegas, Nevada, August 9-12, 2025. The convention will take place at the Paris Las Vegas Hotel and Casino, which includes the Horseshoe Las Vegas, 3655 Las Vegas Boulevard South, Las Vegas, NV, 89109. Room rates are \$159 for single or double occupancy, plus applicable taxes. To make a reservation, please call 702-946-7000 or 877-796-2096. The group name is **Disabled American Veterans**, the Standard Block Code is **SPDAV5** or the Accessible Block Code is **SPDAV5E.** You can also reserve your room <u>online</u>. Accessible rooms are available in the block at either Paris or Horseshoe. Please note that upon booking your reservation, your credit card will be charged a deposit equal to the first night's room and tax. **This one night deposit is non-refundable.** 

The DAV room block will remain open until one of the following occurs: the rooms sell out or upon reaching the cutoff date of Monday, July 7, 2025. If you book your room within the DAV room block, you will qualify for these discounts:

- ◆ DAV discounted room rate of \$159/night
- Waived \$49.95 (plus tax) daily Resort Fee which entitles guests to unlimited local calls, two (2) guest admission to fitness center (does not include use of the hotel spa), and in-room internet access for two devices
- ◆ Complimentary self-parking over program dates of 8/4—8/14/25
- Waived fees for additional occupants in the room, up to four (4) maximum

DAV rate <u>discounts</u> cannot be combined with any other Caesars Rewards/Salute discounts. However, charges paid by you are eligible to earn credits to your Caesars Rewards account.

The DAV Auxiliary will hold their pre-convention NEC meeting on Thursday, August 7, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. Districts will meet the morning of Friday, August 8, 2025, with even districts meeting at 9:00 a.m. and odd districts meeting at 10:15 a.m. Please note—odd-numbered districts will elect new NEC's and Alternate NEC's. The convention will kick-off the morning of Saturday, August 9, with the Joint Opening Session at 8:30 a.m.

The convention registration for 2025 has **increased** to \$35. The process will remain the same. A preregistration page will open prior to convention that will allow attendees to register. As delegate slips are submitted, attendees registration status will change. Attendees 17 years of age and under are not required to pay but must still register to obtain credentials to attend events. **Credentials are required for admission to all events!**

DAV Auxiliary National Commander Christopher Easley has elected to combine his testimonial dinner with the Forget-Me-Not luncheon.
