Who Belongs in the DAV Auxiliary?

- Family and extended family members of veterans who were disabled or died in military service
- Family and extended family members of veterans who have served in the military without sustaining injury
- Family and extended family members of those in active military service
- Family and extended family of Auxiliary members who are not otherwise eligible for membership
- DAV members

Every person who is eligible should belong to the DAV Auxiliary if they believe in protecting the rights of disabled veterans and their families.

We have launched the Caregiver Initiative, an ongoing program to enhance the lives of veteran caregivers. DAVA 4 Kids Grant

This program is designed to assist children age 3 through high school senior whose parent or legal guardian is a current service member or a veteran and who have a financial need. It can assist with payments to attend program camps (sports, band, recreational, religious, etc.), participate in extracurricular activities and help with certain extenuating circumstances.

Education Scholarship

The DAV Auxiliary offers an educational scholarship to community members who dedicate their time volunteering for veterans and their families. Program funding is through a portion of the national mandates and generous donations from members, individuals, units and state departments.

Vocational/Training Assistance

The DAV Auxiliary is committed to helping with the educational needs of those we serve by providing financial assistance, based on available program funds, to ill and injured veterans and their immediate family members seeking education opportunities at facilities other than accredited colleges or universities.
